thank you for your decision to sponsor a child and change a life

The need is great. Every day, more than 24,000 children under the age of 5 die—most from preventable causes such as hunger and disease. Hunger is linked to one-third of all child deaths worldwide. A total of 75 million of the world's children of primary school age are not enrolled in school. Over I billion children are severely deprived of at least one of the essential goods and services they need to survive and develop.*

The statistics are staggering—and sometimes they make us lose sight of the individual lives that are lost to or severely damaged by desperate poverty. The child you have chosen to sponsor is not a statistic. He or she is a beloved child of God.

Thank you for making a long-term commitment to bring hope and help to a life and a community that need you so very much. Please use this booklet to guide you through the sponsorship journey with your child. God bless you.

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praying for me

Your prayers for your sponsored child, his or her family, and the community are crucial. You can pray that he or she will experience God's love, be healthy, and do well in school. If you are sponsoring a HopeChild in a community affected by AIDS (see page 22), please pray that God will meet the special needs of all the community's orphaned and vulnerable children, as well as the needs of its families.

Please also pray that your sponsored child and his or her family will understand that World Vision is motivated to serve them by our faith in Jesus and our desire to reflect God's unconditional love.

Finally, as you get to know your sponsored child, please pray for his or her specific needs. Your long-term commitment to sponsoring and your prayers will help your child reach his or her God-given potential.

writing to me

Exchanging letters with your sponsored child is a great way to get to know each other. This section will give you helpful tips and important information about communicating with your sponsored child. You can also watch the "Getting to Know Your Sponsored Child" video on the DVD found in the back pocket of your welcome kit folder.

what to tell me about yourself

Your sponsored child will be delighted to learn about you and your world! Simple one-page letters are perfect.



Helpful Hint: Photos of you and your family will be especially treasured. Please be sensitive when choosing photos, as standards of clothing and modesty vary in other countries.

Consider the child's environment and culture when choosing your letter topics. Since he or she has very few possessions, it's best not to write about things you own. Rather, share about your family members, your friends, things that are important to you, and simple things you enjoy doing, especially activities like sports or crafts that your child can relate to.

questions to ask me

A few basic questions can help you start to learn your sponsored child's own unique story. Try asking about his or her favorite foods, activities, school subjects, friends, and family.

Helpful Hint: On the DVD in your welcome kit folder, you will find videos that explain more about sponsorship and offer hints about getting to know your sponsored child. These videos may give you ideas for other questions to ask when writing to him or her.

In addition, you might want to learn more about your sponsored child's country. Take this opportunity to learn about a culture that may be new and different to you! If you have children of your own, this can be especially fun for them.



Helpful Hint: In your welcome kit folder, you'll find a small brochure about your sponsored child's country and community. This can be a good introduction to his or her world.

how to send me letters

These three easy steps will help ensure your letter gets to your sponsored child as quickly as possible.





- Write World Vision's national country office address on the front of the envelope. This information is printed on the right side of your child's profile in the front pocket of your welcome kit folder. Or use the pre-printed mailing labels provided with your welcome kit.
- Write your name and return address on the back flap of the envelope, then write your sponsored child's name and ID number at the bottom on the back.

 Please do not write the child's name and ID number on the front of the envelope. For ease of reference, you may wish to record your sponsored child's name and ID number, along with your World Vision account number, in the special space provided on the inside back cover of your welcome kit folder.
- Finally, write your child's name and ID number at the top of your letter. To avoid confusion, please do not write your address on your letter. Your child will write back via their local World Vision office.

Remember that all checks to World Vision, including your monthly sponsorship donation, should be sent to our address in Washington state.



Several times a year, we will send you colorful greeting cards that you can sign and return to us for delivery to your sponsored child. These are always a big hit with the children and an easy way to send a special note of encouragement. Although you will not receive a reply to these cards from your sponsored child, you can be sure that the cards will be kept and cherished.

send me an e-mail!

You might also want to take advantage of our convenient e-mail option to write to your child. To send a message, simply have your World Vision account number, child ID number, and child's full name handy, and go to www.worldvision.org/emailmychild.

The local World Vision office will deliver a printed copy of your e-mail to your child. Though the child will not be able to respond by e-mail, he or she will be excited and encouraged to receive your message—and will send you a response via regular mail.





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getting letters from me

You should receive the first letter from your sponsored child within two to four months after beginning your sponsorship. You will also receive a Christmas or New Year's card and an annual progress report (with a new photo of your sponsored child) each year.

We encourage you to initiate correspondence with your sponsored child. The number of letters you receive from your child depends partly on the number of letters you send. Your sponsored child will respond to your letters; however, it's common for a reply to take up to three to four months. Remote locations and inadequate postal services can result in slower communication. Also, in most cases, a staff member will need to translate the letter from the local language. (You should receive the original letter along with the translation.)

Another thing to remember is that letter writing is a new experience for any child, and many children come from oral traditions. Feel free to write again, even if you've yet to receive a reply!

If it has been more than four months and you haven't received a response from your sponsored child, please call us at **1.800.777.5777** and we'll look into it for you.



if I'm too young or unable to write...

If your sponsored child is unable to read and write, someone will help him or her read your letter and respond. This person may be a teacher, a family member, or a World Vision staff member. If your child has received assistance in writing, there will be a special note on the letter.



Helpful Hint: Be patient if your sponsored child is still developing literacy skills. In many cultures, children may not begin school as early as children in the U.S. Staying in touch is a personal way you can support your sponsored child's education by helping them improve their reading and writing abilities!

sending gifts to me

packages

Many sponsors wish to do something extra for their sponsored children by sending gifts. Unfortunately, due to high import duties and restrictions by foreign governments, local World Vision offices cannot receive large packages for sponsored children. The good news is that you are welcome to send small, inexpensive items that fit into a 6-inch by 9-inch envelope in addition to the letters and greeting cards that your sponsored child will treasure.

Your envelope should be sent to the same address you use to mail letters to your sponsored child. Make sure to include the child's name and ID number on the back side of the envelope. Any envelopes or packages sent to our address in Washington state will be donated to a local charity.





what to send

Here are some small items that sponsored children especially enjoy and that fit into a 6-inch by 9-inch envelope. Use your imagination to come up with others!

- Stickers
- Bandannas
- Pencils
- Picture postcards
- Hair ribbons
- Bookmarks
- Coloring books
- Small puzzles
- Paper airplanes
- Small notebooks or pads of paper
- Colored pencils and a small sharpener (no crayons—they might melt or break)
- Handmade items (small paintings, flat craft projects)
- Drawings made by your children, grandchildren, or children at your church

what not to send





- Toys or other items that appear expensive
- Keepsakes or items of great sentimental value
- · Money of any currency, which could be confiscated

If you have any questions about these guidelines or a specific item you'd like to send, please feel free to call and ask us.

extra financial gifts

You may decide you would like to help your sponsored child and family by sending a special gift above the amount of your sponsorship. To do so, please call us at 1.800.777.5777. Your monetary gift will be sent to the World Vision office in the child's country, where our staff will work with the family to determine what they need most. The item(s) will be purchased locally and may include things like farm animals, school supplies, or a bicycle. To ensure the best stewardship of our field staff's time and resources, such gifts must be \$75 or more.

visiting me

We are delighted when sponsors wish to meet their sponsored children face-to-face. Because of our commitment to child protection and the complexity of travel arrangements to remote communities, we need to know of your desire at least three months before the date you'd like

to travel. A background check for all visitors also is required. Once your visit is approved, we will facilitate the arrangements, including a staff member to act as your guide and interpreter.

transforming my world

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about my country

In your welcome kit folder, you'll find a small brochure that will give you a brief overview of the country and community your sponsored child lives in. This will help you understand some of the challenges faced by your sponsored child and his or her family.

what your help does for me and my community

Child sponsorship addresses a child's most basic needs, both immediate and long-term. World Vision's decades of experience have proven that the most effective way to help a child is to strengthen the child's entire community.

We do this by pooling your sponsorship gifts with donations from other sponsors to provide the assistance a child, his or her family, their community, and other impoverished children need most. We also leverage government grants and goods donated by corporations to provide even more assistance. And, we work with the local people to determine their specific needs, and then help them gain access to the resources that will meet those needs: things such as clean water, improved nutrition, health care, education, vocational training, and economic opportunities.

We encourage you and your family to learn more about this exciting process by viewing the DVD we've included in the back pocket of your welcome kit.

By strengthening the community, we help bring about lasting change. And that offers children a new future filled with hope!

Reaching higher to help children

The best way to help a child is to help his or her community become a better place in which to grow up. World Vision child sponsorship helps families move from poverty toward hope and dignity. To achieve this, we typically work within communities for 10-20 years. The work occurs in three main phases:

Phase I (years 1-3)

Building Trust & Laying Groundwork

- Partnership with community is established
- Needs and resources are assessed and planned
- Child sponsorship begins, projects are planned, work gets under way
- Trust and credibility grow

Phase 2 (years 4-10)

Building Hope & Skills

- Project successes gain momentum
- · Families see change
- Children are nurtured and continue to benefit
- Community takes ownership of its development
- Participation grows

Phase 3

(years II to project completion)

Building Confidence for the Future

- Equipped with tools and training, the community prepares to carry on without World Vision's direct assistance
- Years of hard work bear fruit for children and families

updates on my progress


Each year you will receive a progress report from your child's World Vision Area Development Program (ADP), as well as an updated photograph of your sponsored child. This report will let you know how your gifts are making a difference in your sponsored child's education, health, and community.

if I'm a HopeChild

A World Vision HopeChild is a child who lives in a community severely affected by AIDS.

If you are a HopeChild sponsor, your sponsorship gifts provide specialized care for your child and others in the community. Trained volunteers look after children's emotional, physical, and spiritual needs and help care for sick or dying parents. Counselors promote fidelity in marriage to help prevent the spread of AIDS. And children receive age-appropriate HIV-prevention education that promotes abstinence, along with practical life-skills training.

Our partnerships with local churches and other organizations in Hope communities provide an important advantage, enabling us to reach, help, and mobilize as many community members as possible.

when it's time to say goodbye

We hope your new friendship will be treasured by you and your sponsored child for a lifetime. Sponsorship is a long-term commitment, however the length of each sponsorship depends on the needs of the child and his or her community. Your sponsorship of a child may conclude for one of the following reasons:

my community has "graduated"

The goal of sponsorship is to help break the cycle of poverty so children and families can step into the future with well-founded hope. This graduation event is a time for celebration! When goals are met, the project comes to a close and World Vision moves on to serve children in great need in other communities.

I am self-sufficient!

In many cases, children are sponsored until they finish school, reach maturity, are able to support themselves, or marry.

I've moved to a different community

Occasionally circumstances arise that mean a child must leave the sponsorship program. For example, a child's family may move out of the community into an area where World Vision child sponsorship is not available.

Unfortunately, World Vision cannot continue to facilitate communications between you and a child who is no longer part of a World Vision project.

When your child is no longer available for sponsorship, we will let you know and give you the opportunity to continue your sponsorship journey with another child who needs your help.



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As a child sponsor, you may choose to give your gifts monthly or annually. We invite you to choose the giving method most suitable for you.

Automatic Giving Our Automatic Giving Plan not only offers you convenience and peace of mind, but also helps World Vision to be a good steward of resources by reducing the amount spent on monthly reminder mailings and processing fees. Your sponsorship support will be deducted automatically from your debit card or bank account or charged to your credit card (VISA, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover). To sign up, just call us at 1.800.777.5777.

Check or Money Order When you give by check or money order, your monthly statement will include a reply coupon and an envelope for your next gift. Please make checks and money orders payable to World Vision. Money orders should include your full name, address, ZIP code, and World Vision account number. Please do not send cash.

records of your donations

If you give your monthly donations through our Automatic Giving Plan, you will receive quarterly statements. If you give by monthly check or money order, you will receive monthly statements. If you give annually, regardless of your giving method, you will receive annual statements. And, you can also see all of your giving online anytime at www.worldvision.org/givinghistory.

Sponsorship contributions to World Vision are tax-deductible. Be sure to keep your statements, as they are your only legal receipts for income tax purposes.

- 2 Your donor account number
- 3 The amount of your monthly commitment
- 4 A tax-deductible receipt for you to keep
- 5 A reply coupon and envelope for your next donation
